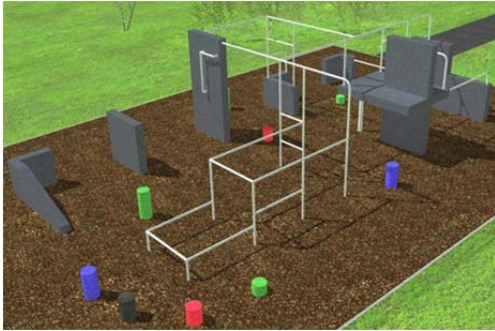

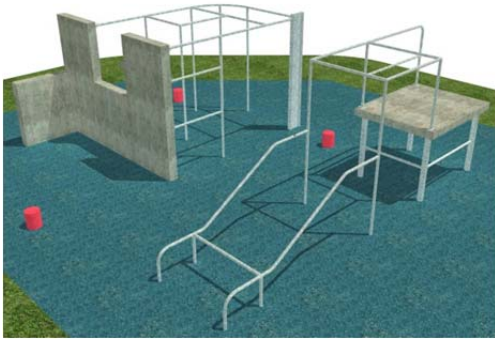

Previous Experience – Installations and Project Management

The Natural Sport team have worked on a number of Parkour projects, managing them from initial concept ideas through to the opening event.

We have worked on projects throughout Europe and varying in value from £20,000 to £350,000.

Here are just some of the projects we have been involved with:

L.E.A.P. Westminster Academy - £350,000

The largest project in the UK £350,000.00 to date is the Westminster Academy project LEAP.

Marcus Reader from our team project managed every stage of the installation.

Due to the height constraints to the site because it was situated partially under the A40 Westway the project had to be phased to ensure that access could be gained at every stage. Liaison with the local authority, Police, Fire service due to the schools access point being in the working area & Network rail as the site runs parallel with the new cross rail line through London. No element could exceed 8 tonne which needed a high level of engineering as the gross weight of the larger elements exceeded 30 tonne making over 60 individual wall sections required to make the L.E.A.P. project.

Grimsby - £60,000

The project at Grimsby was lead by the local practitioner group supported by the local youth worker Adam Johnson.

Parkour was seen as an antisocial activity being carried out by young people due to a lack of understanding of the commitment and dedication being shown by the group. A meeting was called with the local residence and local police. Once the activity of Parkour was explained and the residence and police understood that the practitioners needed somewhere to train and they did not want to use the seafront of garage roofs the project gained backing and momentum.

A member of our team attended meetings at all levels and finally with the portfolio holder who after watching our presentations approved the scheme.

All design consultations involved not only the practitioners but also the local residence and the police. The site was situated on a disused tennis court. The project had bound rubber shred surfacing protecting a combination of walls and framework.

The project was completed in four weeks on site as the lord major wanted to attend the opening. It was an overwhelming success due to the drive of the team and Adam Johnson. The Deputy Police Commissioner for the area has promised funds for further development of the facility after he attended the opening event and got involved. In all approximately 250 people attended the opening of this facility.

The Park Centre, Knowle, Bristol - £55,000

The Park Centre, Knowle, Bristol is a private youth centre with the project again started by the users supported by Richard Martin.

Members of our team attended the design consultation with the user group to ensure that their expectations would be met within the budget allocated.

The area allocated was a disused tennis court with the room for future development if the site proved successful.

The area featured wall, rail and low level sections and was surfaced with bound rubber shred.

The project was completed in three weeks and the final outcome exceeded the practitioners expectations. The project was so successful that phase two to extend the provision of movements catered for has already been completed.
